Education

Adult Literacy Council (M-105):

Free year-round service providing reading, math, and English for speakers of other languages and instruction for adults who function below the seventh grade competency level.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Clarksville (M-1251):

Places positive adult role models with at-risk youth to promote healthy social, psychological and academic development through school-based mentoring and one-to-one friendship programs.

Boy Scouts of America-Cogioba District, Middle Tennessee Council (M-1301, H-1302, S-1303):

Provides opportunities for boys ages 6-18 and girls ages 14-18 to build character and leadership skills through programs designed to encourage youth to become participating citizens and to care for others as well as themselves.

Catholic Charities of Tennessee

CHAP – Creating Hope by Assisting Parents (M-411):

Works with families whose children are at risk for abuse or neglect through home-based counseling, parenting education, crisis intervention, and case management services.

Centerstone

Regional Intervention Program (M-1602):

Nationally recognized parent training program working with families with preschool age children who have emotional, development, and/or behavior problems.

Child Care Assistance, LEAP Intern Program and Supportive Emergency Housing by LEAP Organization (M-273):

The mission of LEAP is to develop and strengthen communities of productive citizenship with values of Leadership, Enlightenment, Academic Achievement, and Perseverance through faith, hope and love by providing mentoring, tutoring, affordable housing, and various assistance programs.

Clarksville Area YMCA Youth Programs (M-250*):

Provides programs and services for children, teens, adults, and families to strengthen the spirit, mind and body. United Way funds support the youth programs financial assistance for the Youth Programs, and Before and After School programs.

Clarksville-Montgomery County Community Action Agency:

Foster Grandparents Program (M-1351):

An inter-generational program that matches seniors with pre-school aged children and their families to help children succeed in school by ensuring their social and academic readiness for kindergarten.

Head Start Program (M-1352):

A family-oriented program providing children and their parents with the skills needed to help the children succeed in school by ensuring their readiness for kindergarten.

Fort Campbell Army Community Services:

Provides comprehensive social service programming to help commanders maintain readiness of individuals by developing, coordinating, and delivering services promoting self-reliance, resilience, and stability of families.

Girl Scouts of Middle Tennessee (M-1851, H-1852, S-1853):

Provides opportunities for girls, ages 5 through 17, for adventure, learning, and fun through programs that build confidence, courage, and character so they may become confident and contributing citizens.

Highland Rim Economic Corporation:

Head Start Program (H-2352, S-2353):

A family-oriented program providing children and their parents with the skills needed to help the children succeed in school by ensuring their readiness for kindergarten.

Hearing Bridges (M-1221, H-1222, S-1223):

Unites the deaf and hard of hearing and the hearing communities through education, services, and support.

Kids on the Block by Students Taking A Right Stand (STARS) (M-274):

The leader in school-based student assistance program services in middle Tennessee. STARS helps schools tackle tough issues that threaten the emotional, psychological and academic well-being of students – issues such as substance abuse, violence, bullying, harassment, family conflicts and divorce, loss, grief, and other concerns. Through assemblies, classroom presentations, and group or individual counseling sessions, STARS Nashville assists schools in preventing and confronting these difficult challenges.

Montgomery County Imagination Library (M-110):

To encourage childhood development and future educational success, the program provides a book each month to each registered child's home at no cost to the family from birth to age five.

Parents Reaching Out, Inc. (M-207):

Provides peer counseling and support to families throughout the region during high-risk pregnancy situations and to parents of premature or critically ill newborns.

Progressive Directions, Inc. :

Early Intervention Program (M-2051, S-2054):

Serves developmentally delayed children birth to three years and their families through developmental screenings and assessments, and behavior management offered through center-, home- and community- based programs, family group activities, transportation, and transition into the school system.

Adult Services Program (M-2052, S-2053):

Serves developmentally delayed adults and their families through center-, home-, and community-based programs, including residential support, supported employment, job placements, activities, transportation, and respite care.

Stewart County Imagination Library (S-310):

To encourage childhood development and future educational success, the program provides a book each month to each registered child's home at no cost to the family from birth to age five.

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Health

Ajax Turner Senior Citizens' Center (M- 225):

Provides daily lunches at reduced prices and a variety of activities, including education, health screenings, exercise, support groups, evening dances, and more to seniors aged 55+.

Adult Day Care Program (M- 2251):

Provides families with a senior member who has lost their ability to live independently an option to nursing home care by providing care for those seniors during the day.

Clarksville-Montgomery County Community Action Agency:

Old Firehouse Day Shelter and Community Resource Center (M-1353):

Shelters homeless and working poor during the day. Offers job search support and training, transportation, housing assistance, food, and clothing on site through several agency partners of the Resource Center.

Crisis Intervention Center (M-1551, H-1152, S-1153):

Provides telephone hotline services 24-hours, 7-days a week, including: crisis hotline for anyone in need of crisis intervention and suicide prevention; 2-1-1 information and referral line; and school safety hotline.

Fort Campbell Armed Services YMCA (M-173):

Serves military service members and their families throughout the region through programs such as childcare, hospital assistance, spouse support services, food services, computer training classes, health and wellness services, & holiday meals.

J.D. Lewis Senior Citizens' Center of Houston County (H-230):

The Center offers a wide range of activities, games, crafts, and fellowship opportunities for seniors. Exercise, art, and craft groups meet regularly. Health screenings and potluck meals are offered several times a year.

Mobile Cafe by Manna Cafe' (M-272):

Consists of taking hot, appetizing meals to homeless camps, parking lots, and/or other gathering places, both indoor and out. Sometimes includes worship and a brief church service. Available on Tuesday and Thursday nights and Saturday Morning Community Breakfast (in cooperation with Grace Community Church).

Mid-Cumberland Human Resources Agency:

Homemaker Program (M-1961, H-1962, S-1963):

Provides a variety of services for our most vulnerable citizens, from housekeeping, meal preparation, transportation, shopping, etc. for the elderly & disabled, to training in parenting skills, budgeting, resources and nutrition for families with children or adults at risk of abuse, neglect, or exploitation.

Meals-On-Wheels (M-1951, H-1952, S-1953):

Provides group or home-delivered meals to individuals ages 60 and over to help maintain their health and independence and enable them to remain at home.

Nurses for Newborns of Tennessee (M-1231, H-1232, S-1233):

Provides a safety net for families most at-risk to help prevent infant mortality and child abuse and neglect through in-home nursing visits that provide healthcare, education, and positive parenting skills.

Progressive Directions, Inc.

Buddy Ball Program (M-2055):

Provides individuals with a mental or physical disability the opportunity to participate in sports, regardless of their limitations. Buddy Ball helps individuals learn teamwork and promotes self-esteem, one of the tools needed to help overcome the stigma often associated with a disability.

"Reclaiming Me" Program by Child Advocacy Center for the 23rd District (H-275):

Provides a place for children who are victims/alleged victims of child abuse. They receive support after a report of child abuse has been made. Located in Charlotte, TN, they work with the police and child protection services to speak with children in a safe and child-friendly location.

United Methodist Urban Ministries:

Safehouse Domestic Violence Program (M-2151, H-2152, S-2153):

Provides a safe shelter for domestic violence victims, a crisis line, counseling support groups, and other supportive assistance, including jobs, housing, clothing, and follow ups after leaving the shelter.

Turning Point Transitional Housing (M-2154):

Provides transitional housing to domestic violence victims following stay at the shelter.

Youth Center Cooperative (Houston County Youth Center) (H-270):

Offers opportunities for youth in Houston County and the surrounding region by providing a wide variety of safe, positive, and relevant activities.

***Vanderbilt Bill Wilkerson Center (All Counties - 245):**

Provides comprehensive diagnosis and therapy for children and adults with problems related to hearing, speech and language, as well as brain injury rehabilitation for adults and teens.

Bethesda Community Mission, Inc. (H-217):

Provides emergency assistance, including food and financial assistance for utilities, shelter, prescriptions, and transportation.

Legal Aid Society (M-1161, H-1162, S-1163):

Provides free legal advice and representation to eligible clients with civil issues including domestic violence, housing, health care access, and other matters that impact family well-being and stability, and community education on legal rights and responsibilities.
